from Student Rabbi Cohen...

As American Jews, we often feel the tension between our secular and Jewish identities. Especially during the national holiday of Thanksgiving, our lives become bi-furcated. We often leave our Jewishness behind to join in the celebrations. Each year, I ask myself, "how can I integrate these two parts of who I am: American and Jewish? How can I integrate these two factors of myself and allow them to reinforce one

another? Why must I live in tension?"

Judaism and Thanksgiving have more in common than one may think. First, Thanksgiving, which celebrates the fall harvest, is a lot like our own harvest holiday of Sukkot. We need only to add the *HaMotzi* blessing to our Thanksgiving meal. Through thanking God for bringing forth bread from the earth, we realize that this holiday gives us one more opportunity to recognize God's works over the bounty of the earth. Second, consider Thanksgiving an extra chance to recite some of Judaism's daily prayers for thanks and praise. The prayer Modah ani l'fanecha (I give thanks to You) is part of the Jewish morning ritual to thank God for another day, as each day is a blessing. In my family, we have a tradition of going around the table and sharing what we are thankful for. Third, both the pilgrims as well as the Jews seem to have some very important values in common: that of family and friendship. In 1621, when the pilgrims invited Native Americans to celebrate their first, successful harvest, they demonstrated this value.

So this year, when I join my family at the Thanksgiving table, I will make the choice to celebrate as both the American and the Jew that I am. I hope you will join me. We do not have to live in two, separate spheres. When we make the conscious choice to look at our whole lives through a Jewish lens, allowing our religion to penetrate every instance of our lives, we can find added meaning. We can more fully live "Jewishly."

- 2) Concerns need to be specific and understandable. Submissions that are too vague and generalized cannot be addressed.
- 3) Complaints/grievances need to include a possible suggested remedy. (Complaints without at least one suggested remedy will not be addressed.)
- 4) What is going right at Temple?
- 5) Anything involving policy will be discussed with the MZ board...again...the author of the issue will remain anonymous.

The best way to deal with concerns is to shine the light of day on them. so that they can be openly analyzed and resolved, thus eliminating—or at least mitigating—the small pockets of discord or unhappiness. I invite your input.


